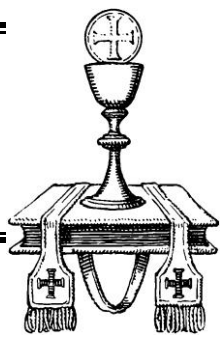

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the priest of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord.” (James 5:14) These words form the Letter of James, reminds us of the power of prayer and the importance of ministering to the sick.

There may be some people, for one reason or another, that cannot attend Holy Mass or cannot make their way to the Church. And although God makes Himself present to all people in all places, there is something supremely special in have God come to the sick in Holy Communion; we can remember the passage how Jesus went to Peter’s mother-in-law and healed her (Luke 4:38). What I am saying, is there may be people, whether they be family, friends or neighbors, that may need some sacrament: Communion, Confession or Anointing of the Sick. GOSPEL of Sunday September 19 Mark 9.30-37

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, “The Son of Man is to be betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again.” But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house Jesus asked them, “What were you arguing about on the way?” But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest.

Jesus sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, “Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.”

Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, “Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.”
