**GOSPEL Mark 13.24-32 of Sunday November 14**

Jesus spoke to his disciples about the end which is to come:  
 “In those days, after the time of suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.  
 “Then they will see ‘the Son of Man coming in clouds’ with great power and glory. Then he will send out the Angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.  
 “From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates.  
 “Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

“But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the Angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.”

**PASTOR’S MESSAGE**

Dear Friends,  
 On July 6th 1921, the Poppy Flower was officially adopted as the National flower of remembrance, particularly for those souls that have given their life in service for their Country, for Freedom and for Truth. This year – the Poppy Flower and Remembrance Day - celebrate its centennial anniversary.  
 On this day Canadians pause in silence to remember those who have passed away in war, in violent aggression and those veterans that have passed away afterwards. This is a day of both prayer and peace. It also serves us to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community and as a nation to defend freedom, truth and love for our Country. We would be doing them a grave injustice to ignore the truth, to belittle freedom, and to pay little concern for our Country. As citizens to this country, we have a duty to want to bring the faith of Christ to her land. When Christ commissioned us to bring the Gospel to all nations (Mt. 28:19), He first wished that we accomplish it our own nation.

And so, in a spiritual sense we can also ask ourselves what are we doing to bring the peace and love of God to this Country – in honor of God and those souls that gave given their life for this country. It is important for us as a believing community to redirect ourselves in prayer and in action to the ideals Jesus have given us; particularly the Gospel and the Beatitudes. “Our homeland is in heaven, where we are waiting for our savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, to come from heaven.” (Philippian 3:20)

Divine providence has given us this additional day within the Month of November (that is, in addition to the notable All Souls Day) as another incentive to pray for souls and to work towards Heaven.
