PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,
 Over the last couple of weeks, we celebrated two anniversaries; first, the 71st Anniversary of Saint John the Baptist as a Parish Community (Nov. 6th) and now we celebrate the 112th Anniversary of Sacred Heart Church (Nov. 21st). These two anniversaries so adjacent to each other brings us to consider the spirit of gratitude for having a house to pray in.

And so, we can ask ourselves this week, 'Do I consider the Church my home? Do I consider it my home like Jesus did?' As our Lord says to His mother when He was lost in the temple, "Did you not know

that I would be in my Father's House?" (Luke 2:49) For me, a priest who lives in the Rectory only ~20 meters from the Church, it may appear much easier to answer this question in the affirmative; but I think we should all consider the Church our home – that is a home for our soul.

What is a home? A home is where we find rest, where we go for shelter and where we receive nourishment. The Church, whether we are more associated with Saint Johns or Sacred Heart, has these three elements. (1) In the Church we find rest for our soul, as the third commandment promotes - understood in the spirit of God's creation – 'on the seventh day he rested for all the work of creation.' (2) The Church is our shelter, the refuge place for our soul. There is no other place the soul would rather be than to find refuge in the house of God the Father. (3) In the Church we find nourishment, for here we are nourished by the bread from Heaven, the Eucharist, or as the Psalms tell us 'the bread of angels'. Therefore, in this spirit of familiarity do we celebrate and appreciate both of these anniversaries all the more! Happy Anniversary!
