PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

This week we will talk about the second Cardinal Virtue, the virtue of Justice. Throughout scriptures the word 'just' is often used as an adjective to reference to a person that is upright or is observant of the will of God. (*Proverb 24:16, Matthew 1:19, etc.*)

Tanquerey, a spiritual author, defines justices as "to give to others at all times that which is strictly their due." Therefore, there is justice to God when we give Him proper worship which is the virtue of religion. Justice towards parents which is called honor. Or justice towards our neighbors which is called human respect.

Justice helps us to consider what we should do for others and helps us to consider how much time we ought to spend with each person. It would be unjust to spend time with family and spend no time with God. It would be unjust to spend time with friends and neglect to spend time with one's family. And it would be unjust to spend excessive time on media and television and as a result neglect all of the above (God, families and friends). In some way, we can say justice along with prudence and temperance helps us to see what we ought to due for others.

The virtue of justice also asks of us to make restitution. For example if someone gossip or calumniates (*speaks lies about another person*). The virtue of justice ask that we work to repair the harm we caused the person – that is harming their 'good name'. Therefore, restitution ask that we speak well about that person. Restitution also ask that we restore anything broken; return or pay for anything stolen; etc.

In a spiritual perspective, justice ask that we love God above all things and love our neighbor as ourselves. Love God above all things because "For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore, glorify God in your body." (1 Cor. 6:20) And love of neighbor in obedience to Jesus Christ our Lord, "love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34)

GOSPEL Luke 5.1-11 of Sunday February 6

While Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets.

Jesus got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signalled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink.

But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!"

For Simon Peter and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed Jesus.
