PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

This week we will focus on the Virtue of Faith, the virtue that is the most basic and fundamental to any notion of religion. In general faith can be defined as a firm persuasion (or conviction) whereby a person accepts a truth that is not seen. As the book of Hebrew says, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." Faith is one of the three theological virtues – along with Hope and Charity.

The Latin word for faith is *fide* or *credere* (properly translated as 'to believe') which also means "to be persuaded." By faith we are persuaded by God that He exist (that the bible is the Living Word of God and that our Lord is truly present in the Eucharist) because although we do not see, nor do we touch or hear God - we believe that He exist.

There are two ways a person can be certain of knowledge; one is by intellectual reasoning – that is by learning things on our own. The second is by faith - by believing in another's credible authority; ultimately,

we believe that God Exist because we believe he reveals Himself in Jesus Christ.

To believe is a choice we make. God give us the choice to believe or not. A theologian also writes, "We believe, not because we see, perceive, as discovering something true, [we believe] because we desire something good" ...we believe because we desire the unimaginable good God offers us.

There are three elements to the virtue of Faith:

-Credere Deum – 'to believe in a God' - that is that we believe that God exist. With all our heart and with all our mind we are certain that God exist.

-Credere Deo – 'to believe towards God' – believing in the credibility of God. It is one thing to believe that a God exist – *as many people now-a-days do* - but it is another thing to believe that God is trustworthy. And this can be the difference between reading the bible as a book or as the Word of God; or the difference between receiving communion with apathy or receiving Communion with great love, piety and devotion.

-Credere in Deum – 'to believe into God' – this is to believe in God so as to move towards God. A faith that lures us to Heaven or a faith that constantly calls us closer to God. And this is the most perfect and highest form of faith. We believe unto God, we believe until we arrive to God.

Faith is most essential and fundamental to our religious life, as the Book of Hebrew says, "...without faith it is impossible to please him [God], for anyone who approaches God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him." (Hebrew 11:6). Let us ask God for growth in faith this Lent.



GOSPEL Luke 9.28b-36 of Sunday March 13

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white.

Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to Jesus. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his exodus, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.

CATECHISM WORD CORNER

Penance (Sacrament of): The liturgical celebration of God's forgiveness of the sins of the penitent, who is thus reconciled with God and with the Church. The acts of the penitent – contrition, confession of sins, and satisfaction or reparation – together with the prayer of absolution by the priest, constitute the essential elements of the sacrament of Penance.
