PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

This weekend falls between two great solemnities; the Solemnity of Saint Joseph (March 19th) and the Solemnity of the Annunciation – also known as the Incarnation (March 25th). And so, I thought it would be convenient to talk about the importance of these two significant days. Although they are not days of obligation, it is highly encouraged to attend mass these days because of their significance.

As you may know, Saint Joseph is the official Patron of Canada. The Recollect Franciscan first presented him as patron when Canada was still known as 'New France.' The early missionaries attribute the answers of many prayers and the fruits of their many apostolic works to St. Joseph. Only three years later in 1637, Pope Urban VIII officially announced St. Joseph as Patron of Canada.

Just as our confirmation Saint, Patron of our Faith - who ceaselessly pray for us, so does Saint Joseph ceaselessly pray for the people and the country of Canada. What a consolation, to think the Spouse of Mary and the Foster Father of Our Lord; has been

named Patron of this Country. In 1870, Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph Patron of the Universal Church.

This Friday, on March 25th we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation - when the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would bear the Son of God and the Eternal Word of God took on flesh. This marks the single most important event in the History of Salvation. Our very salvation, our very existence and our being here today in the Church rests upon this moment. Which is also why whenever we pray the creed, during the words, "...who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary..." we all bow our heads in a solemn act of love and gratitude for this most sacred event.

Our Faith grows immensely with the observance of these solemn feast. Let us therefore hold dear to our hearts these two most solemn days. Also, you can break fast and penance on the Solemnity of the Annunciation, and yes...you can eat meat too even though it's a Friday in Lent. (*Code of Canon Law 1251*)

Emergency Relief Effort for Ukraine

GOSPEL Luke 13.1-9 of Sunday March 20

Jesus was teaching the crowds; some of those present told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.

Jesus asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them – do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

Then Jesus told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?'

"The gardener replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"
