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PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Great news! On June 24th 2022 - the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus - at 10:10 a.m. the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade! The vote was 6-3 in favoring of overturning Roe v. Wade. As we know the Catholic Church holds very dear the importance in defending the dignity and value of human life from the moment of conception to natural death. As a Church document, Evangelium Vitae 9 also says, "human life, belongs only to God: for this reason, whoever attacks human life, in some way attacks God himself." And so, we can add,

whoever defends life also defends God and all the gifts He bestows on the world.

If humanity is willing to attack and/or kill their fellow kinsman (as Cain attacked his brother Abel), what could come of the world, what hope would there be in humanity. No longer could man trust his neighbor, much less could man seek the common good and wellbeing of society. Instead, each would seek their own personal interest and society (humanity) would inevitably fall apart.

It was said by the U.S. Supreme court, "the Constitution does not confer a right to abortion; Roe and Casey are overruled; and the authority to regulate abortion is returned to the people and their elected representatives." Despite abortion not being completely illegal, this is a huge step forward in keeping and safeguarding the dignity of Human Life. We must only continue to pray that other countries may follow in the progressive path.


Our Lady of the Cape, Queen of Canada and Queen of Intercessors is COMING to Peterborough!!



GOSPEL Luke 9.51-62 of Sunday June 26

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for Jesus; but the Samaritans did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem.

When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But Jesus turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.

As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head."

To another Jesus said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." But Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

Another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home." Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

Catechism Word Corner

Life: Both God's gift of created human life and His divine life given to us as sanctifying grace. Beyond its ordinary meaning of human life, Jesus used "life" to signify a share in his own divine Trinitarian existence, which becomes possible for those who respond to his invitation to turn away from sin and open their hearts to God's abiding love. Eternal life signifies that this gift will last forever in the blessedness of heaven. This gift of God begins with the "life" of faith and "new life" of Baptism (1225), is communicated in sanctifying grace (1997), and reaches perfection in the communion of life and love with the Holy Trinity in heaven (1023).
