## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

As we continue to review the Five Precepts of the Church; the second precept is to receive the sacrament of reconciliation – *by bear minimum* – at least once a year (especially during Lent).

We are all sinners whether we acknowledge it or accept it, we are all guilty of sin. As the first letter of Saint John says, “If we say, ‘We are without sin,’ we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us...we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.” (1 John 1:8,10) Even the Jews who were at the point of stoning the woman caught in adultery accepted their sins.

The death of Christ on the cross is personal reality. Every time we confess our sins we accept this immense act of mercy, but when, we deny our sins, we make vain His entire passion and death. If we deny our Sins, we deny His death for us.

In some way, every confession is a renewal of that desire for salvation. If we go to confession seldom, that renewed desire and longing for salvation and heaven becomes scarce. While if we confess often our sins then that desire is renewed often. Nothing gives us greater hope and security of heaven than knowing we have come out of confession having confessed our sins well. And how do I know if I have confessed my sins well?

– If I took time to examine my conscience (not rushed) – some people rush because they are afraid to find sins they didn’t know they committed.

– To be sincerely contrite for my sins – we are truly sorry for our sins.

– Resolve not to want to sin again – no one can promise never to sin again, but we all can promise never to want to sin again.

At the seminary, we were encouraged and highly advised, ‘if you want to be perfect as your heavenly father is perfect, examine yourselves often and go to confession often.’ We would have confessions every week, a great help for those who want to live a holy life.

### From our Bishop Most Reverend Daniel J. Miehm


