## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Encompassing this weekend are two major celebrations; one catholic (the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary) and the other a secular holiday (Thanksgiving), a very beautiful celebration as well. We can in some way combine these two celebrations.

First, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary reminds us of that decisive victory at the Battle of Lepanto. In which the Catholic Faith was at the verge of extinction at the hands of the Turkish

Navy. But thanks to the powerful intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the urgent request from Pope Pius V for Catholics to pray the Rosary for this intention the Catholic Faith was preserved. Thanks to those faithful Catholics and their fidelity to Mother and the Rosary we now have the opportunity to learn and practice our faith.

The Rosary – *along with the Bible and Sacramentals (Crucifix, Holy Water, etc.)* – are the most powerful weapon any Catholic can grasp within their hands because they invoke upon the Almighty God and the Powerful intercessor Mary. As Saint Louis de Montfort says, “the rosary is the most powerful weapon to touch the Heart of Jesus, our Redeemer, who loves His Mother.” And as Saint Padre Pio adds, “...the rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today.”

But the rosary is not only a powerful weapon, but it is also and more importantly a prayer of thanksgiving. I say more importantly, because redemption has already been won, evil is already conquered we just have to participate in that victory with Christ and Mary. And the Rosary allows us to participate in that victory. Therefore, rosary is a prayer of first and foremost a prayer of thanksgiving for the salvation won for us by Christ and Mary.

Thus, this thanksgiving, among the many things we give thanks for let us first and foremost give thanks to our God for having called us into this life and for granting us this most precious faith. ## GOSPEL Luke 17.11-19 of Sunday Oct. 9, 2022

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee.

As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!”

When Jesus saw them, he said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus’ feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan.

Then Jesus asked, “Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?”

Then Jesus said to the Samaritan, “Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.”
