Dear Friends,

For a parish to flourish in its various activities and apostolates it needs the generous help of its parishioners. In a household each family member has chores for the development of the family and the house as a whole. Likewise

## GOSPEL Luke 18.9-14 of Sunday Oct. 23, 2022

Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and regarded others with contempt:

"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.'

"But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!'

"I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

### Catechism Word Corner

**Peace:** One of the fruits of the Holy Spirit mentioned in Galatians 5:22-23 (CCC 736). Peace is a goal of Christian living, as indicated by Jesus who said "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God" (CCC 1716). The Fifth Commandment requires us to preserve and work for peace, which was defined by St. Augustine as "the tranquility of order," and which is the work of justice and the effect of charity (CCC 2304).
