## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Last week in the bulletin announcements there was a brief explanation as to what the Christmas Novena is - 'Las Posadas'. The term 'Posada' means 'the inn'; the name "Las Posadas" was given to the Christmas Novena recalling the days in which Mary and Joseph were looking for an inn where the Son of God could be born.

"Las Posadas" originated in Mexico in 1578 by Augustinian friars who wanted to celebrate an extra mass throughout the Christmas Novena to teach the native people the Catholic faith and to provide them with reflections in order to prepare for the Birth of our Jesus. The nine day celebration is also symbolic of Mary's nine months of pregnancy. Now-a-days 'Las Posadas' is not only celebrated throughout Mexico, but also in other American Countries (North and South America).

The Augustinian friar would have never imagined that his dedication and effort would bear

so much fruits and lead to something that would still be practiced over 400 years later. "Las Posadas" is celebrated with great enthusiasm and joy. *As Advent and Lent are distinct; Lent is in preparation for a Sacrifice (Good Friday) then a joy (Easter Sunday). While Advent is in preparation for an immediate joy – Christmas. Just as any family waits in joy for the birth of a new born baby so too do we await in joy for the birth of Jesus.*

There is no strict manual on how a Posada is to be observed as it can be adapted to fit the place it is celebrated at; but a very common structure is given. First, the Posada Song (a call and response song – in which the group is divided into two parties, one group is outside and the other inside imitating a humorous dialogue between Joseph and the innkeeper). Second, a rosary and reflection (the spiritual aspect). This is followed by food, a moment of company and sharing (Sweets, Hot Chocolate along with other traditional foods and games). Lastly, carols, songs in joyful anticipation. We will be alternating day to day between Sacred Heart and Saint John the Baptist. Hope you can join us! Together in Prayer

## GOSPEL Mark 1.1-8 of Sunday Dec 10

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

As it is written in the Prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'" John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
