PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

As briefly mentioned in last week's homily, there are many things within the Church (decoration, colors, arrangements) that have liturgical significance. There are other decorations that also remind us of the spirit of Christmas.

A very common treat used within the time of Christmas are **Candy Canes**. The candy cane is a **hard candy** that is supposed to remind us that Jesus is our Rock (the corner stone of the Church's foundation). The **candy's shape** reminds us of two things: that Shepherd's staff as Jesus is the Good Shepherd and when flipped upside down it is meant to form a "J" for Jesus. The **color red** represents the blood of Christ – the blood of the baby Jesus that will be shed for our salvation. The **color white** signifies purity – the purity and innocence of the baby Jesus, like the

spotless lamb. Thus, Jesus is the spotless lamb - who knew no sin - that shed His blood for our salvation.

The seasonal flower is the Poinsettia, the red star-like flower. The Poinsettia is meant to symbolize love, hope and goodwill. Love as red implies sacrifice, reminding us that all acts of love imply sacrifice – as the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross is also the greatest act of love. The flower looks like a star, and the symbol of a star is a sign of hope. It also reminds us of the star of Bethlehem, as the three wise men were guided by the star of Bethlehem in hope to find the King of kings.

Another common means of decoration are the candles at the window sill. The Irish Catholics would put candles at their window so that priest may know they were invited to stop by their home to celebrate Holy Mass. In some way, this was also a sign of hospitality and constant vigilance.

Reminding us of the constant vigilance of the wise virgins who had their lamps lit until the day of the Bridegroom's return – which is the meaning of Christmas eve; vigilance until the day of Christ's birth (or return).

GOSPEL John 1.6-8, 19-28 of Sunday Dec. 17

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, “Who are you?” He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, “I am not the Messiah.” And they asked him, “What then? Are you Elijah?” He said, “I am not.” “Are you the Prophet?” He answered, “No.”

Then they said to him, “Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?” He said, “I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, ‘Make straight the way of the Lord,’” as the Prophet Isaiah said.

Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, “Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?” John answered them, “I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.” This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.
