# PASTOR'S CMESSAGE

Dear Friends,

On February 2nd the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord or also known as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary – 40 days after the Nativity of Jesus. At the presentation of the Lord, Simeon the Prophet prophecies a prayer as he takes Jesus into his arms proclaiming Jesus Christ to be the light to the world when he says, "...a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel." Luke 2:22-40.

These prophetic words announce Jesus as the light who has come into this world to dispel sin and darkness. Thus, feast reminds us of the gift of light that we have received through him. Traditionally, since about around the seventh century, candles have been blessed at the beginning of this Holy Mass of the Feast of the Presentation. This Mass is called the "Candlemas." The blessings of Candles also remind us that we have received the light of grace and salvation from Christ – the one true light of the World. Similarly, as we receive the lite candle at our baptism from the Pascual candle (which represents Christ).

At this moment during the baptism the priest prays, "You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your hearts. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet Him with all the Saints in the heavenly Kingdom." (*Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*). We have all received the faith through Christ and we are all entrusted to keep the faith burning through: prayer, virtue and joy.

I like to give the comparison that just as a fire has three elements necessary to make a fire (the Fire Triangle): Fuel, Heat and Oxygen. If one of these three elements is missing a fire will never start or die away; so too is the light of our Faith. Fuel represents prayer, the more fuel (wood) you put into a fire the bigger the fire gets (the more we pray the bigger our faith becomes). Heat represents virtue, just as heat attracts us for warmth (so does virtue attracts us all to Christ). Lastly, Oxygen represents Joy, for without oxygen a fire suffocates (without joy we suffocate in our Christian obligations).

Thus let us remember these Candle Mass our responsibly to care for our faith – the light entrusted to us. All parishioners are invited to bring candles to be blessed at the Candlemas on Friday, February 2nd, 8AM at or 6:30PM at Sacred Heart.
