PASTOR'S CHESSAGE

Dear Friends,

This upcoming Tuesday, March 19th the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saint Joseph. St. Joseph is considered the patron of many things, therefore we can also say there are many reasons to honor his Feast Day. He is the Chaste spouse of the Blessed Virgin, the foster father of Jesus, a Model to Men, the Patron of a Holy Death, the Patron of the Universal *Church (in 1870 by Pope Pius IX)*, and the Patron of the country of Canada *(in 1625)*. Among all these, I would like to focus on His role as the patron of a Happy and Holy Death.

There is a very strong tradition that states that Saint Joseph would have died in the presence of Mary and Jesus. Although there is no Gospel passage that narrates or supports this claim, there is also no strong argument to would indicate that Mary and Jesus would have abandoned St. Joseph in his final moments. Therefore, Saint Joseph inspires us to want to die in a similar fashion – in the company of Jesus and Mary. We can only imagine, there is no better way to die than in the company of Jesus and Mary.

There is a very beautiful prayer in a devotion '30-day prayer to Saint Joseph' that reads, "I ask it by the perfect love and conformity you showed in accepting the Divine order to depart from this life, and from the company of Jesus and Mary." St. Joseph knew how to resign himself to the Will of God; open to accepting the moment in which God would call him from this life to the next. Nowadays, with constant medical inventiveness, we are sometimes tempted to play the role of God; of choosing life or death when we want, thus going against Divine Providence. To choose death (euthanasia) would deprive a person of the opportunities that God wishes to bestow on that person to continue to receive graces for heaven or to offer up their struggles and paints for the atonement of their sins.

Saint Joseph is an amazing patron to recourse to either for ourselves (preparing ourselves for our own death) or to pray to him for a loved one that they too may die in the Company of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Together in Prayer

GOSPEL John 12.20-33 of Sunday March 17

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. The person who loves their life loses it, and the person who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

"Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say — 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name."

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."

The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An Angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
