Dear parishioners,

It is with great sadness to inform you of the passing of Father Clair Hickson, a son of Sacred Heart Parish. Father Clair was baptized at Sacred Heart in 1933 and attended Sacred Heart School and St. Peter's High School. He was ordained a priest at St. Peter's Cathedral on May 29, 1965.

Father Clair served as assistant at St. Joseph's Parish, Bowmanville from 1965-1966, and taught at St. Peter's High School from September 1967 to June 1978. He was appointed the first pastor of St. Francis

Assisi Parish, Newcastle on June 23, 1978 and served there until becoming pastor of St. Mary's Parish, Huntsville on January 15, 1981. He was pastor at St. Martin's Parish, Ennismore from June 1989 until 1990. Father Clair was pastor of St. Mary of the Visitation Parish in Campbellford from June 1990 until his retirement on September 1, 2010, after which he resided at St. Anne's Parish in Peterborough. He was appointed Judge for the Marriage Tribunal (Peterborough) from 2012 until 2020. Fr. Clair Hickson passed away peacefully at the age of 91.

GOSPEL October 6

Some pharisees came, and to test Jesus they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" Jesus answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her."

But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the tow shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. Jesus said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

People were bringing little children to him in order that Jesus might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them: for it is to such as these that the kingdom of god belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

And Jesus took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.
