PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As we journey through the holy season of Advent, the Church invites us to reflect deeply on the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. One of the most beautiful and ancient traditions during these final days leading up to Christmas is the singing and meditation of the O Antiphons (6th century). These antiphons, prayed from December 17th to December 23rd, accompany the Magnificat during Vespers and the Roman Missal and are familiar to many through the hymn, *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*. Each antiphon highlights a unique title for Christ, drawn from Scripture:

December 17: (O SAPIENTIA) O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18: (O ADONAI) O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19: (O RADIX JESSE) O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20: (O CLAVIS DAVID) O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21: (O ORIENS) O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22: (O REX GENTIUM) O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23: (O EMMANUEL) O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

I encourage you to make these antiphons a part of your daily prayer during this time. Reflect on the titles and what they reveal about Jesus' mission. May these sacred words draw us closer to the joy and wonder of Christmas. In Christ,

GOSPEL Luke 3.10-18 of Sunday Dec15

The crowds, who were gathering to be baptized by John, asked him, "What should we do?" In reply John said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise."

Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, John proclaimed the good news to the people.
