As we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord this Sunday, we are invited to reflect on

the profound moment when Jesus was baptized in the waters of the Jordan by John. This feast reminds us of Christ's humility and the revelation of the Holy Trinity, as the heavens opened and the Father declared, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

This year, our joy is deepened by a historic event: the consecration of the new Catholic Shrine of the Baptism of the Lord in Al-Maghtas, Jordan, on January 10th, 2025 by His Eminence Cardinal Pietro Parolin, Secretary of State of the Vatican, and His Eminence Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem.

Al-Maghtas, recognized as the holy site of Jesus' baptism in the Holy Land, is a place of immense spiritual significance, where the waters of the Jordan have borne witness to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. The fact that this new shrine will be entrusted to the care of our religious family, the Institute of the Incarnate Word, fills us with gratitude and responsibility.
