PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
This week, I invite you to reflect on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, a powerful mean to order one's life and direct it towards God. As the title suggests- "Spiritual Exercises to Conquer Oneself and Regulate One's Life Without Determining Oneself through any attachment that is disordered" - these exercises lead us to interior freedom, allowing God to shape our lives according to His divine will.

At the beginning of the Spiritual Exercises St. Ignatius presents to us the Principle and Foundation, which calls us to recognize that we are creatures, created to praise, reverence, and serve God, and by doing so, to save our souls. Everything else in our lives, such as talents, relatives, wealth, etc... are given to us to obtain the end for which we have been created. Therefore, our use of them should be in proportion to the end for which we have been created.

Saint Ignatius structures the Exercises into four weeks: The First Week is the Principle and Foundation, Sin and the possible eternal destinies of our soul. The Second Week, the Life of Jesus is presented to us as a model to follow. In this week, the exercitant organizes and plans his life after Christ. In the Third Week, the Passion of Christ is presented to us to reinforced the purposes made in the Second Week. In the Fourth Week, the Resurrection of Christ is presented to us to know what awaits us after this life.

Spiritual Exercises have been a machine for making saints throughout many centuries. A great example are the Canadian Martyrs, who model their entire life after this retreat as can be seen in their writings. Let us ask through their intercession and of our Blessed Mother, for all those who will participate in these Retreats in the coming weeks.

GOspel Luke 6.17, 20-26 February 16, 2025

Jesus came down with the twelve and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon.

Then Jesus looked up at his disciples and said: “Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.
