Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners,

On this Second Sunday of Lent, the Church presents us with the Gospel of the Transfiguration. But why do we hear this passage now when the Feast of the Transfiguration is celebrated on August 6th? Because at the heart of this event is the "EXODUS that Jesus was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" (Lk 9:31) - that is, His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

The Transfiguration is a moment of profound significance. By looking at those present at this event, we can understand its importance:
First, we see the Most Holy Trinity: the voice of the Father, the cloud is the Holy Spirit, and the Son transfigured in glory. Then, we have the presence of the Old Testament: Moses, representing the Law (since it was given through him), and Elijah, representing the Prophets (as one of the greatest among them). Together, they signify "the Law and the Prophets," a common expression for the Old Testament. Finally, we see the presence of the New Testament in Peter, James, and John, the three disciples who would later witness Christ's agony in Gethsemane.

Why did Jesus transfigure Himself before them? The Transfiguration occurred just weeks before His Passion. The disciples would soon see their Master crucified and buried, and their faith would be shaken. So Jesus revealed His glory in order to strengthen their faith in preparation for the trials to come.

Just as the Transfiguration prepared the disciples for the Passion, our moments of grace prepare us for times of struggle. This Lent, let us ask the Blessed Virgin Mary to help us understand that times of consolation are meant to sustain us in times of desolation, knowing that all things lead to the final victory of Easter.
