PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend, we reflect on the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The key to understanding this parable is found in the opening verse: "The tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to him, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, 'This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So to them he addressed this parable".

The phrase "to them" reveals the purpose of the parable: it is directed at the Pharisees and scribes, who were criticizing Jesus for welcoming sinners. It is also noteworthy that the Gospel refers to "this parable" in the singular, even though Jesus actually tells three parables: 1- "What man among you having a hundred sheep...?" (a man's perspective); 2- "What woman having ten coins...?" (a woman's perspective); 3- "A man had two sons..." (God's perspective). For Jesus, these three parables form one unified teaching. The message is clear: If a man rejoices upon finding a lost sheep...; If a woman rejoices upon finding a lost coin...; Then how much more does God and the angels rejoice when a sinner repents?

Regarding the Prodigal Son, when he says: "I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you...'" The Fathers of the Church see this as an image of the Sacrament of Confession. This coming Saturday, April 5th, we will observe the "Jubilee Day of Grace." Throughout the Diocese, all parishes will offer Confessions at different times. I encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity to receive the Lord's mercy.

Also, please remember that one the Precepts of the Church obliges us to receive Holy Communion and go to Confession at least once a year, especially during the Easter season (Canon 920 and 989).

GOSPEL Luke 15.1-3, 11-32 of Sun. March 30

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

So he told them a parable: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So the father divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country,

and there he squandered his property in dissolute living.

"When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. The young man would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything.

"But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands.'"

"So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him.

"Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe — the best one — and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate. "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. The slave replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.'

"Then the elder son became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!'

"Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'"
