PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear parishioners,

Today, on this beautiful feast of **Divine Mercy** Sunday, the Church invites us to plunge into the infinite ocean of God's love, a love that meets us precisely where we are: in our need, in our brokenness, in our misery. There is a simple

reasoning that helps us grasp the depth of today's celebration:

1- There is **no greater misery** than sin.

2- There is no greater mercy than when God Himself stoops down to lift the sinner from his misery.

3- And God does this in the Sacrament of Confession.

This is why today – Divine Mercy Sunday we have in the Gospel the Institution of the Sacrament of Confession: Jesus breathed on the Apostles and said: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (John 20:23). It is here, in the confessional, where Divine Mercy is shown in its most direct and personal way. The very word mercy comes from the Latin misericordia - a union of *miseria* (misery) and *cor* (heart). Mercy, then, is the Heart of God reaching down our **misery**, to forgive us.

St. Faustina Kowalska, the humble apostle of Divine Mercy, left us a simple prayer that is like a lifeline to every soul: "Jesus, I trust in You." In her diary, she recorded the words of Jesus urging us never to doubt His mercy. Even if our sins were like scarlet, His mercy is greater.

Never, never doubt His mercy.

Dear friends, let this Sunday not be just a beautiful devotion but a personal encounter. If you have not been to Confession in a while, this is a great opportunity to receive God's Divine Mercy.

SOSPEL John 20.19-31 of Sun April 27

It was evening on the day Jesus rose from the dead, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side.

Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas, who was called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

After eight days his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
