PASTOR’S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
This weekend, the central theme is Mission. The Gospel says “At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, ‘The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest’”
The word “mission” comes from the Latin **mittere** and the Greek **ἀποστέλλω** - both meaning “to send.” That is why Jesus called His disciples Apostles - those

who are sent. The importance and authority of any mission depend on two things:

- 1- Who sends the person, and
- 2- What the mission is about.

In our case, the one who sends is **God Himself**, and the mission is nothing less than **the salvation of souls**.There is no higher calling.

At Baptism, we were made Christians - “*other Christs*” - and therefore share in Christ’s mission. As the Father sent His Son into the world - “*God so love the world that sent His Only Son...*” (Jn 3:16)—so Jesus sends us: “*As the Father has sent me, so I send you*” (Jn 20:21) “*All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations*” (Mt 28:18–19)

Once, on January 17, 1878, a fearless missionary, Msgr. Augouard, stepped off a ship on the coast of Gabon, Africa. An official snapped curtly at him: ‘I am sure, Father, you won’t be able to live here.’ The missionary to Africa quickly replied: ‘I have not come to live; I have come to die.’
Let us renew our commitment to the mission entrusted to us: in our families, our parishes, our workplaces, and beyond. May we be generous laborers in the Lord’s harvest. And let us also ask our Lord for more laborers (vocations). May our Blessed Mother grant us this grace. Amen.

GOSPEL Luke 10.1-12,17-20 of Sunday July 6

The Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore, ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.

Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace to this house! ‘And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves his wage.

Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, ‘Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near. ‘I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town.

The seventy returned with joy, saying, “Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!” Jesus said to them, “I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.”
