# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. When we look at the Gospels, we notice that Jesus seldom speaks about His own feelings. But when He does, it is always to teach us something essential. In one moment, He says: "I have come to bring fire upon the earth, and how I wish it were already blazing!" That fire is the fire of divine love—a love He longs to see burning in our hearts.

Immediately after, He speaks of a "baptism" He must undergo, saying, "What anguish I feel until it is accomplished!" That baptism is the Cross. Jesus unites both thoughts: the fire of love and the baptism of the Cross. His greatest desire is that the fire of God's love be ignited in us, and that love is expressed most fully in His sacrifice upon the Cross. We see this desire clearly in the Way of the Cross. At the second station, Jesus—wounded and scourged—embraces and kisses the Cross as it is placed upon His shoulders.

Contrast that with Simon of Cyrene at the fifth station, who carries the Cross reluctantly, afraid of being mistaken for a criminal. This difference shows us God's disposition toward the Cross and our human hesitation before it.

The Apostles Peter and Andrew, brothers, representing the west and the east, both died crucified. Peter by being crucified upside down in the Vatican Hill. His brother Andrew by being crucified in a cross in a form of X. Tradition tells us that as soon as St. Andrew caught sight of the Cross from afar, he himself cried out, greeting it in this way: "Hail, O glorious Cross, sanctified by the body of Christ and adorned with His members, more richly than if you had been decorated with precious

stones! Before the Lord consecrated you, you were a symbol of reproach, but now you are and shall always be forever a testimony of divine love and a most desirable object.

That is why I now walk to you with firmness and joy. Receive me also with gladness and make me a true disciple of Him who hung upon you. O holy Cross, beautified and ennobled from the time the members of the Lord rested, nailed upon you! O blessed Cross, long desired, eagerly loved, constantly sought, and now at last made ready!

To you I come with burning desire, that you may embrace me in your arms, take me from this world, and bring me to my Master and Lord! He, who redeemed me through you, and by you forever, He may receive me!"

Let us ask our Blessed Mother, who stood faithfully at the foot of the Cross, to obtain for us the grace to love the Cross of Christ with all our hearts.
