PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,
This Sunday's passage is a beautiful passage. The context of this Gospel: Jesus had sent 72 disciples to do mission ministry. And when they returned, they were very happy and joyful for the miracles, conversions and even the demons subjected to them. Let us remember that the 12 Apostles were simple people, fishermen. And the other 72 Disciples may have been simple people as well. Then Jesus tries to

rectify their intentions by saying: *"do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you (pride), but rejoice because your names are written in heaven"* At that very moment Jesus REJOICED in the Holy Spirit and said, *"I give you praise, Father, Lord of heaven and earth"* This expression seems to born from His Heart and it is full of sentiment *"for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones"* He contrasts 'the wise and the learned'- that is, the Scribes and Pharisees- with 'the little ones'- that is, the Apostles. When He says, *"these things"* He is referring to the spiritual joy that simple people experience in contemplating God's works. This joy is hidden from the proud of heart, for pride prevents them from seeing it.

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; And you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light" It was very common among Jews to talk in metaphors 'the yoke of the Law'. A yoke is a wooden instrument, kind of heave, which is place in the back of the neck of ox or mules, so that they can plow the field or pull a cart. The yoke of the old law were all the rules and demands of the Old Law. The yoke of the new law are the demands of the Law of Grace.

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened" because the Pharisees *"tie up heavy burdens - hard to carry - and lay them on people's shoulders"*. But He says, *"come to me... for my yoke is easy, and my burden light"* A yoke is not easy and a burden is not light. But the because of the Presence of the Love of the Holy Spirit inside ourselves, every persecution, every suffering, every cross is made easy. And He finishes giving us His example *"learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart"* that is, meek in temper and humble in accepting the Divine Will. Let us ask Our Blessed Mother that we may put all our trust in Jesus.
